Our goal is to unravel the territory trough an attentive welcome in unique structures, recognizable by their style, privileged location and high-quality services.





1. Mohala




















Adriatic Coast

Torre Sant'Andrea and the Faraglioni

Located on the Adriatic coast of Salento, Torre Sant'Andrea represents a must-see destination for nature and sea lovers.

This picturesque piece of heaven is known for its impressive Faraglioni, wonderful sea stacks that, emerging from the crystal-clear waters, create a one-of-a-kind breathtaking landscape all the way around.

The white cliffs and the several sea caves, sculpted by the wind and the waves, offer a suggestive scenery, but it's at sunset that Torre Sant' Andrea charms its visitors, when the Faraglioni are tinged with warm colors and offer a spectacular show able to captivate whoever allows themselves the pleasure to admire them.

To walk along the coast, to take a dip in the reinvigorating clear waters and to admire the wonders of the surrounding nature are some of the must-do experiences in Torre Sant'Andrea.





Otranto and the Alimini Lakes

Otranto, gem of Salento, is a city rich in history and charm. With its historical center characterized by narrow and winding streets, ancient churches and the majestic Aragonese Castle, it invites you on a journey back in time, through its art and history. Perfect for the lovers of birdwatching, of walks and bike rides, the Alimini Lakes represent an oasis of calmness and unparalleled natural beauty.





Marina di Andrano and Grotta Verde

Marina di Andrano, overlooking the Adriatic coast of the Salentinian peninsula, provides a serene refuge for who wishes to dive into unspoiled nature. Tricase Port

Located at a short distance from Santa Maria di Leuca, Tricase is a hidden gem of south-east Salento. Its fascinating historical center, rich of memories and architectural treasures, unfolds among suggestive lanes, white houses and stately mansions. The town is composed of two main areas: Tricase Center and Tricase Port. The latter, the city's marina, has less than three hundred inhabitants and is located on the Adriatic side of Salento, Crossed by the coastal road that connects Ponte del Ciolo and Santa Maria di Leuca in the south and Otranto in the north, Tricase Port is an ancient fishing village with a port which dates back to the fifteenth century. This port, with its small coves and inlets accessible only by sea, it's an ideal place for who sought calmness and silence. But Tricase is more than just a seaside destination. In fact, the city is known for its culinary heritage, with several restaurants and trattorias. Also, throughout the year, plazas and lanes come alive with festivals and religious celebrations, which reflect the rich local folklore.



















Galatina

Galatina is a hidden treasure to be discovered. Acclaimed for the rich historical and cultural heritage, it unveils its ancient churches, suggestive lanes and millenary traditions to the visitors' eyes. The heart of the city is represented by wonderful churches, such as the Church of San Pietro e Paolo, a masterpiece of baroque art dating back to the end of the fourteenth century, completely frescoed inside.

But Galatina is also known for its gastronomy, consisting of authentic and genuine flavors, such as the "pasticciotti", a traditional dessert dating back to 1745. In addition to its cultural and gastronomic attractions, in Galatina many traditions are still alive and tangible, such as the pizzica, ancient popular dance connected to the phenomenon of tarantism. Folkloristic events, art and cuisine animate the city throughout the whole year, offering visitors the opportunity to fully dive into the authentic atmosphere of Salento.







Specchia

Specchia is a place where time seems to have stopped.

Its historical center is a maze of cobbled lanes, ancient mansions and suggestive plazas that tell of centuries of history and tradition. The heart of the historical center is Piazza del Popolo, where are located Palazzo Risolo and Chiesa Madre, with its elegant baroque façade. But Specchia is also known for its hypogeum oil mills, ancient oil mills carved in the rock that testify the importance of producing olive oil during the past centuries. These visitable places, offer an insight into peasant life and traditional working techniques, representing an inestimable heritage of cultural value.

The attention to preservation and care of the historical heritage makes Specchia one of the most wonderful towns in Italy, rewarded with several recognitions. To visit this fascinating town means to dive into an authentic atmosphere, in which history and tradition blend with the landscape's beauty and locals' hospitality.





Underground oil mills to visit

Under the streets of Specchia a trail known as "the road to hypogeum oil mills" wends its way. This route includes the Ex Convento dei Francescani Neri, Perrone Street, Prince Orsini Street, Cicca Street and Garibaldi Street, and unfolds mostly underground.

Along the suggestive route, it's possible to admire four underground oil mills: **Scupola**, **Cicca**, **Perrone** and **Francescani Neri**. These oil mills, along with many others present in Specchia's underground, testify the enormous production of olive oil that this town boasted during the past centuries.

Guided tours, available with a free donation, are organized by Specchia's ProLoco, situated in Piazza del Popolo.

The nearest airport, in Brindisi, is less than 90 km away from the villa.





















Tipical food

Pasticciotto and caffè leccese

Salento isn't only renowned for its natural and architectural wonders, but also for its culinary specialties among which pasticciotto and caffè leccese stand out.

Pasticcioto is a traditional dessert typical of Salento, invented in Galatina in the nineteenth century and consisting of an external short crust pastry, filled with custard.

Traditionally eaten at breakfast, the pasticciotto has become a symbol of local patisserie, loved by adults and kids.

The caffè leccese, on the other hand, is a fresh and original drink, ideal for warm summer days. Prepared with espresso coffee, almond milk and ice, the caffè leccese is more than simple drink: it's a sensory experience that symbolizes the hospitality and the joy of being together.

Both, pasticciotto and caffè leccese, are authentic expressions of Salento's culture and tradition.





Salentinian frisa

The Salentinian frisa, also known as frisella, is one of the most representative dishes of the poor cuisine of Salento, but at the same time it's one of the richest in flavor and tradition. This simple food is a sort of toasted bread made of durum wheat flour or barley flour, obtained from double oven cooking.

The making of the salentinian frisa starts by soaking it in cold water to turn it from hard and crunchy to pleasantly soft. Once it reaches the desired consistency, it's served with fresh and genuine ingredients which enhance its flavor, such as ripe tomatoes, extra-virgin olive oil, oregano and a pinch of salt. An ideal dish for any occasion- fast lunches or summer outdoor dinners- but it's also a symbol of conviviality and sharing: to make it and taste it in good company is in fact a habit passed on from generation to generation. The salentinian frisa perfectly embodies Salento's spirit: essential, genuine and profoundly bound to our land and traditions.





Rustico leccese

The rustico leccese is one of the most loved specialties of the culinary traditions of Salento.

It's made of two discs of puff pastry and filled with a tasty combination of bechamel, tomatoe and mozzarella cheese, traditionally eaten as street food it represents a must for whoever visits Lecce and Salento.

In fact, it's very easy to find it in bakeries, bars and local rosticcerie, where it's served straight from the oven, to better enhance its rich flavor.

Valued for its taste as well as its versatility, its an ideal snack to have while walking in the historical center of Lecce or as a quick break for any moment.

The simplicity and quality of the ingredients is what makes the rustico leccese such a special and beloved dish from anyone and the symbol of Salento's cuisine: genuine, tasty and able to win you over at first bite.
